

Sure, she sometimes brings me the book to ask how to say a word or what it means, but that starts a conversation and helps to make her interested in something new. I highly recommend this book! If you have inquisitive children, you definitely need this book. It is full of wonderful information - really good stuff. I like it a whole lot and my children and grandchildren have enjoyed it as well.
