

My daughter LOVES it. Loves it so much that we read it over and over and over again. On that level, I am extremely happy and it was totally worth the purchase. But it is a TERRIBLE representation of Washington, DC. The book about Pittsburgh (where my wife is from) had such great representation of the city. The sights were distinctly and absolutely identifiable as Pittsburgh. I'm a native Washingtonian, and they couldn't have included the Capital Building? They couldn't have shown the carousel on the Mall? How are "Reporters sharing the news with the world" a unique character of DC? And while I realize there may be some controversy about including our football team, maybe DC United or the Washington Capitals? How do I demonstrate to my daughter that DC is a great city when the illustrations show tourists and their bare feet?

I want to love this book. We have several in the series, always recommend them, and purchased this one to read while a family member was in DC. Unfortunately, the illustrations do not begin to compare to those of the one page of Washington DC in "Good Night America." The kids were looking forward to finding things in the book from the picture messages we were receiving from our family member, but were very disappointed. Instead, several of the illustrations could easily be from anywhere (any museum or office) and aren't identifiable. It was a waste. Even though it is only brief, the DC in "Good Night America" is far superior.

I give this little book every time a friend or family member has a baby. I live in DC and it's a nice memento (and I harbor ideas that it will entice parents to take the little ones on a trip to visit us!). Simple little board book.

Cute book! We bought this for my 3 year old as we were preparing to move to DC. It was very age appropriate and nice for him to point out the places he knew- and the places he still had to visit! We have quite a few of these "Good Night Wherever" books from places we have visited and we love them all! Such wonderful little books!!

Very poor representation of women in the illustrations. Only 1 female lawmaker and her head is partially obstructed by a male character, the scientist and engineer are men, only 1/4 of the justices was a woman, etc. It appears as though the majority of women are mothers. I'm really disappointed and don't plan to read it to my daughter again.

This book caught my eye because Goodnight Moon was one of my favorites growing up. While very different, I still appreciate it! I first saw it in a DC museum, and was glad to find it here on . It's a small little board book that fits well into purses, car pockets and such. A great review of DC for those who know it well or are just learning about it.

We love this series, and try to get a book from places we visit, to read to the kids and remind them of the things we saw/did during our trips. Sometimes we can't find them during the trip so we buy them afterwards online. Would also be a good idea to get them excited about a destination beforehand!

I bought it for a friend for a baby shower. Everyone briefly went through the book and thought it was pretty cool. It is probably more enjoyable for the adults to see which DC sights they included, but it's still fun.
