

This is a a very cute book about a little girl named Lola and how she goes about her morning at the library. The illustrations are vibrant and engaging for my kids. The story line is simple, what one would expect for a children's book. I have bought dozens of children's books on but the reason I am taking the time to write a review for this one is because this is one of the few books with a Black character that doesn't have a storyline relating to race or hair texture. The main character is Black and there are other races featured in the book. I am the mother of biracial children and I wanted to make sure they have books that show children from various races. The thing is when I started searching for books with Black characters, all I got were books about how being black is beautiful, I love my hair, my skin is beautiful etc. I am not trying to get into race talks with my preschoolers, I just want regular stories showing diverse characters every once in a while. So THANK YOU Ms. Mcquinn and Ms. Beardshaw. I am writing this review for parents who are also searching for a book showing diversity without it being the plot of the story.

My family has fallen in love with this book. The text and illustrations are both top notch. But I must admit we fell in love with the illustrations immediately. They are superb!!!Little Lola gets so much joy from her trip to the library that it truly is contagious. It's great for encouraging the love of books and reading.
