

My two year old son loves this book, and has been inspired to push his wheelbarrow around our garden, dig lots of holes in the dirt, plant seeds and water. This book is good for 2 year olds and older children. The illustrations are loving and wonderful.

My 4 1/2 year old loves this book. It very basically tells the steps for planting a garden, from buying seeds and earth, to planting and weeding, and finally to eating what you grew. It has wonderfully set the stage planting our own garden.
