

The only problems I had was some of the directions are not right with the software, on rare occasions pictures didn't match or where hard to understand. Starts of walking you through the task with what to do step by step. Then progresses to telling you the task without the walk through. Some task you should do step by step, some you should read ahead to get the best understanding of the direction they are going. Mostly its provides you a safety net, but you should try different things to figure out faster ways. That being said sometimes they tell you multiple ways to do the same task that I wish they would mark better as a alternate way to do what you have already done. Also contains end chapter task to practice what you have learned.

Currently using this book for a SolidWorks course. Step by Step instructions are easy to understand but never 100% perfect. Once your skills develop you will figure out there is always a way of completing a step i.e. doing the step individually instead of 4 at a time, just to get the Lesson completed. Absolutely a great book to get if your starting from scratch or just getting back to basics.
